- Q. That she used the 25-gauge needle.
- A. I typically use the ones in the kit.
- Q. Okay. Are you familiar with that small -- a 25-gauge needle or a small diameter needle can sometimes cause hemolysis in blood samples?

MS. COLLINS: I'm going to object to the form of the question as assuming facts not in evidence.

DIRECT EXAMINATION (CONTINUED)

BY MS. PARKER:

- Q. As an emergency room doctor and your knowledge training, and experience, have you ever had the occasion to learn either through studies or on your own in conducting tests that a higher gauge needle, smaller diameter needle can cause hemolysis in blood samples?
- A. There's a lot of factors that cause hemolysis in blood samples. Needle size is definitely one of them. Rate at which it comes out is another one. Vessel use is another one, so there is lots of different caveats that go along with it.
 - Q. Okay. Fair enough. Thank you.

All right. Now it says on here at 5:20, it says to x-ray w/c for chest x-ray.

A. Wheelchair.
