24 Q. And did -- and you looked into the canal?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. You didn't see anything in the canal, did you?

2 A. No.

3 Q. It was very dark there, wasn't it?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. Almost pitch black?

6 A. It was dark.

7 Q. The only lighting was on the other side of the
8 intersection by the school?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. There's no lights at all where this car was?

11 A. No.

12 Q. And did you see -- you saw -- as you mentioned
13 you drove over, but you also saw debris, did you not?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. Meaning parts of the car?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And you thought those were all parts of the
18 Bentley?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. Did you see anything that looked like the
21 parts, or part, of any other car other than the Bentley?

22 A. No.

23 Q. Thank you very much.
