1	Q. And Ruth Poulsen, of course, was your
2	instructor?
3	A. Yes.
4	Q. And you know that Mr. Kelly works with
5	Mr. Searcy?
6	A. After that, yes.
7	Q. And you know that Mr. Kelly and Mr. Searcy were
8	two of the lawyers who were suing Mr. Goodman?
9	A. After that, yes.
10	Q. So you certainly became aware that the Searcy
11	law firm was the law firm that was seeking a lot of money
12	from Mr. Goodman?
13	A. I only know that Searcy's law firm was a
14	representative of the family?
15	Q. No. You knew more than that; you knew that
16	they were suing Mr. Goodman?
17	A. I don't know any monetary values.
18	Q. You knew they were suing Mr. Goodman?
19	A. Yes.
20	Q. Mr. Kelly made arrangements for you to go to
21	Mr. Searcy's office, did he not?
22	A. Yes.
23	Q. And you had a meeting with Mr. Kelly and
24	Mr. Searcy at the law offices?
25	A. Yes.

1	Q. And at that time, they introduced you to a
2	lawyer named Harry Shevin?
3	A. Yes.
4	Q. And Mr. Shevin became your lawyer?
5	A. Yes.
6	Q. And it's been Mr. Shevin has been your
7	lawyer for almost two years?
8	A. Yes.
9	Q. Have you ever paid Mr. Shevin a fee for his
10	services?
11	A. No.
12	Q. In the two years, have you ever paid him any
13	money at all?
14	A. No.
15	Q. You know that Mr. Shevin had formerly been a
16	member of the Searcy law firm?
17	A. They made me aware of that, yes.
18	Q. At the time that he began to represent you, it
19	was made aware to you that he had been connected with
20	Mr. Searcy?
21	A. Yes.
22	Q. Who's paying Mr. Shevin's fees?
23	MS. ROBERTS: Objection.
24	THE COURT: Overruled.
25	MS. ROBERTS: Speculation.
